Fire Safety

- Fires in apartment communities present a higher risk of danger than to standalone houses.
- can spread to the adjacent apartments,
- DO NOT smoke inside the units. (25 feet off of BHA's Property)
- Keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children
- Check regularly for electrical hazards such as worn electrical chords, overload extension cords and outlets, and broken appliances
- Don't store flammable liquids in your apartment
- Ensure your smoke detectors are working properly
- Report non functioning smoke detectors to your site office immediately
- Do not grill within 10 feet of your porch
- Never leave cooking unattended even if it is for a "few minutes".
- Cooking is the leading cause

Memorial Day dates back to the Civil War, starting as a way to honor soldiers who had died during the war. It is said to be inspired by the way southern states honored the dead. In May 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson declared Waterloo, New York as the birth place of Memorial Day.
